### **Applied Healthcare Chaplaincy** **#Making a Difference on the Ground**

Over the last three years, the College, and indeed the whole profession, has been increasingly focussed on “What does good look like” as we go forward. This year, as we meet in person, we want to apply best practice to action on the ground, reflecting on our teams and on ourselves as individual chaplains.
